Props

1. Examination sheets* – one sheet per student

5. MT Examiners IDs* – for the Examination Commission (3 people)
6. MT EXPERT cards* – for those, who will pass the examination
7. Tables of multiplication table – to check whether the answers are correct

Program

8.00– 8.15	Opening ceremony.	Headteacher announces: <i>World Multiplication Table Day starts today.</i> Coordinator describes purposes of the event.
8.20– 13.00	Examinations for students	Examination Commission sits by one bench. Examination sheets are in the basket. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Examinee gets examination sheet from the basket. 2. Examiner announces: <i>START!</i> and turns on the stopwatch. 3. Examinee reads examples from the sheet and gives oral answer on each example. 4. Examination Commission supervises exams: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> – Passed examination – when all given answers within 3 minutes are correct. – Not passed examination – when at least one given answer within 3 minutes is incorrect. 5. Each person, who passed an exam receives the MT EXPERT title. Examination Commission gives successful examinee high five or a dap. 6. Not passed examination can be repeated after an 1 hour.
17.00– 18.30	Class meeting of teachers and parents. Examinations for parents.	
12.00– 13.00	Games	Those, who passed an exam, participate in games: “Mathematical soccer player”, “Queen of the jump rope”.
Few days after the event	Summary of the event	Coordinator describes summary of the event on the school board: number of examinees, people, who passed an examination.
